

HOW TO BECOME A DELEGATE* OF THE NORTH AMERICAN BAPTIST CONFERENCE TRIENNIAL 2018

A delegate of the North American Baptist Conference plays a special role in the direction of the Conference. A delegate can vote to elect officers, transact any necessary business, and approve resolutions.

To be a delegate, you must be a current member of an NAB church or association-approved church plant. To qualify, you must fall in to at least one of the following categories:

- An officer of the Conference
- A member of the General Council
- A board member of a Cooperating Organization
- An executive administrator or full-time faculty of Taylor College and Seminary or Sioux Falls Seminary
- A missionary appointed by The Conference
- A retired NAB pastor or missionary
- A member of the Executive Team of The Conference Office
- A Regional Minister

If none of these apply to you, you can still be a delegate through church membership. A pastor of an NAB church or association-approved church plant may appoint delegates from their membership body.

These categories include:

- Senior pastor or alternate
- Members of pastoral staff nominated by the church to be a delegate
- Lay person (one lay person for every fifty members of the church, or fraction thereof)
