And we recognized women who have strategically passed the baton of faith on to this younger generation through their ministry. Melissa, April and


Jean left the women of British Columbia with an invitation to join our

them in this setting within our church feels like I've been put right where I belong in this season of life.

MICHELLE - I have served in the kid's ministry program since I started attending Bethany in 2008. There was time spent with the newborn babies and then with the preschool age kids and then on Friday Nights or at our Moms and Tots program. I always felt drawn to serve in this area in some capacity, where I get to know the kids and see their growth when they start understanding their role in God's kingdom. Last summer, I had been praying to God to open a door and show me where He wanted me to serve. I had surrendered myself to His will and within the week I was asked to take on a part-time role in the Children's Ministry program and work alongside Angelika. I instantly felt God's call on my life and with much excitement I accepted.

## Describe the program you have for kids at Bethany.

We have lots of programs we run within Children's Ministries at Bethany.

From week to week throughout the year we have our Sunday Programming which is for kids Newborns-Grade 5. We have been doing the curriculum from Awana Sunday School which teaches the same story at different age levels every week. It has allowed the opportunity for parents to talk to their kids about what they learned and everyone is talking about the same thing, but with some different approaches. Our hope is to keep parents as involved in what we are doing as we can. We get to plant the mustard seed at church, but the biggest impact is what the parents can continue at home.

Tuesday mornings for about 2 hours we open our doors to moms, dads, grandparents... anyone with a toddler before school age to come and spend time in a play group. This program has been running over 20 years and we have not encountered any years where no one comes. We have a consistent 10-15 caretakers that bring their little ones every week. We put out some snacks and coffee for parents, snack time for kids and then a craft and singing time. Almost all parents are from the community and we have been able to walk alongside

them whether it's just in sharing day to day things or spending time in prayer with them as they are struggling through something. It has been SUCH a blessing for us and we have had the opportunity to create great friendships with our community.

Friday Nights, we have a program for kids in Grade 1- Grade 5. This year we are using the theme 'Identity Kids'. We have 2 hours where we get to play in the gym, have a snack and then do an activity that teaches Gods character and who WE are meant to be as image bearers of Christ. We are made in the image of Christ and what other people say about us does not define us.

Outside of that we host a Carnival for our community each year, with bouncy castles, face painting, cotton candy and a wide array of games. We see LOTS of community kids coming through the doors with their parents. This gives us an opportunity to not only connect with the kids but with the parents. We have had parents come for this event that have moved away or their kids have grown out of our program because of the impact we have been able to have through the above programs over the years. This event, I have to say, is my favourite and fills my heart each year.

Lastly, we have our yearly VBS. A week long adventure with kids/teens and adults learning who God is and practicing out what that looks like in our lives. It is a busy week with just under 200 kids attending, but it is such a joy to see how it brings our church community together working as a team as well.

# What do you consider the three most important ingredients in ministry to kids?

MICHELLE - 1. Being flexible/adapting to change 2. Patience 3. Loving the kids like Jesus loves us.

ANGELIKA - Providing a place for kids to have a safe space that they can come to and know they are loved/cared for.

 Finding fun/engaging ways to show them who God can be in their lives

- and why what Christ says is more important than what the world is trying to teach them.
- Building relationships/mentorship not only for the kids to have someone to speak with and trust as they grow up but with the volunteers as well and that they take on that role as a mentor as well.

## How do you serve the parents of the kids in your programs

We have only JUST taken on specific ways to serve the parents in our church community. Last year we hosted a taco lunch to try to engage parents with each other. We have noticed a lot of parents dropping off their kids, going to the service, picking up their kids and leaving right away after pick up. The lunch allowed for parents to come join around tables with each other, eat, and get to know each other. We hope to host another lunch at some point this year.

We have also set up a table as parents exit the church service where they can find activities to do with their kids at home and ideas of things to do with their kids to follow up with their lessons each week. The hope is for parents to congregate in that area which may also spark conversation, but we will see how that follows through.

## How do you encourage/build up your kid's ministry volunteers?

First and foremost, when it comes to our volunteers, we try to walk alongside them. Giving them breaks from one Sunday to the next is key while encouraging them in the giftings we see them use. We make sure to be there to thank them each week. Small words of encouragement, tokens of appreciation (cards with treats) can go a long way to let them know we see them and do not take them for granted. Our program cannot run without them.

We also make a point to host a thank you breakfast for all of our volunteers each year. Free waffle breakfasts seem to be a hit.

# The Women of Kairos

airos University, a multi-denominational institution was formed when Sioux Falls Seminary and Taylor Seminary joined together to offer outcome-based theological education in any context. This union has opened the door for students from all over the world to receive accredited degrees. But much more than that, Kairos is a discipleship journey that focuses on content learning, character development, and practical ministry experience. In this series, we are excited to introduce you to some of its female students around the globe who keep on working and serving while learning in their context.

It is our joy to introduce you to **Miriam Modi**, one of our global partners with the North American Baptist Conference International Missions. We will be featuring women from around the globe who are/have been involved in Kairos University theological education.

Miriam grew up in Romania in a Hungarian-speaking family and has served in full-time ministry for the past four years. During this time, she has partnered with the North American Baptist Conference, Camp Falcon Rock, and local Hungarian Baptist churches to organize camps and faith-building events for children, teens, and young adults.

She first heard about Kairos University from the North American Baptist missionary couple in Romania, who had studied there themselves. They highly recommended the program as a great fit for her as a young woman seeking formal theological education. Miriam completed her bachelor's with Kairos and is now working on her Master of Divinity degree.

Miriam shares that being a student at Kairos has allowed her to continue serving full-time in ministry while growing both in knowledge and in spirit. The integration of study and practice has challenged her to actively apply what she learns within her ministry context.

Through various courses, she has learned to be more attentive to the world around her — observing, questioning, and seeking to understand people and contexts more deeply. She shares: "This process has shaped my perspective, teaching me to look outward so I can serve those entrusted to me with deeper relevance and effectiveness. Moreover, Kairos has encouraged me to intentionally reflect on God's activity in my life, keeping me on a continual journey of growing in love, awe, and faithfulness to Him."



In Miriam's context, which tends to be more conservative, her greatest challenge and joy come from pioneering new ground. While more women in Romania are stepping into full-time ministry, few have in-depth theological education or serve in teaching roles. She hopes to help expand these opportunities—not only for herself but for the many young women who will come after her with a heart to serve faithfully and use their gifts.

As Miriam prepares for her future, her vocational calling is to serve teenagers, young adults, and local churches throughout Romania. She desires to see greater inclusion of those often marginalized or overlooked—whether women, youth, or people from different ethnic and denominational backgrounds. She longs to see barriers broken down and the body of Christ united, each member actively playing their part to bring the body to fullness under its head, Christ, and complete its calling in this world.

## White Cross USA Update: Debbie Long

s an entirely volunteer-run ministry, White Cross USA has been blessed by ■God with a great number of volunteers and an abundance of medical supplies and equipment to ship to Cameroon. From November 2024-September 2025, we have shipped 5-40 foot shipping containers filled with equipment and supplies. This has been the busiest year since White Cross moved to Bismarck in November 2020.

Many US churches financially support White Cross as do many individuals who contribute monthly. With the cost of shipping a single container being \$11-12,000 we have spent \$60,000 on the transport of hospital beds, exam tables, waiting room chairs, IV poles, over the bed tables, and a host of other items for medical clinics and hospitals. Our shipments also include medical supplies of 4x4 bandages, rolled bandages, absorbent padsitems which are historically associated with White Cross ministry.

Across the North American Baptist Conference of Churches, we have witnessed dozens of churches supporting the ministry with

medical supplies. A church in California sent a box of sewn drawstring bags which are perfect to use as a gift bag to hold all of the baby items that we send. Other churches White Cross have joined in the sewing of



these colorful cloth bags. Each mother receives the bag filled with a blanket, 2 cloth diapers, a sleeper, a knit baby hat and a welcome Bible verse for their newborns.

We average about 3 work teams at the spacious warehouse in Bismarck, ND and are blessed to have students and adults from the North Central Association who sort and inspect supplies donated by local hospitals, nursing homes and laundries.

We are thankful for the support of many NAB churches, and blessed to be able to serve alongside everyone who is willing to serve in this medical ministry to the bothers and sisters in Christ in Cameroon.




#### **Your God Knows**








## The Jesus Shaped Life


will experience how biblically sound theology deepens your relationship with God and each other.

by John Mark Comer


