REFLECTIONS FROM 2023

Women in Leadership – Ally Turner



We have been highlighting women connected to NAB who are serving in ministry leadership within their churches and communities. Our hope is by doing so, we can encourage and support other NAB women in leadership. We would like you to meet Ally Turner, Women's Ministry Coordinator at Grace Community Church in Detroit Michigan.

What drew you to Grace Community Church in Detroit as their Women's Ministry Coordinator? Describe your role as coordinator.

My husband and I started attending Grace around 2000. I was a high school special education teacher and coached girls softball and basketball. Our first daughter was born in March of 2001 and I decided to put teaching on hold and stay home a few years while we raised a family. I thought I could meet other stay at home moms

by volunteering in the nursery at Grace's Women's Tuesday Morning Bible Study. My first day was 9/11. Hard to forget that day. After that first year, I realized I needed to be AT those bible study tables rather than in the nursery. I met so many wonderful women around those tables. I learned so much from the scriptures, the faithfulness of God, the sweetness of sisterhood in Christ, caring for one another amidst life's joys and sorrows. After 5 years, I received leadership mentoring and began serving as a table facilitator and did so for years.

I was getting ready to go back to teaching when our youngest daughter went into middle school in 2018. That is when the previous Women's Ministry Director of 30 years, Penny, asked me to pray about taking over her roll. I was very apprehensive initially because I didn't see myself as a "planner". And this roll requires a lot of planning. She responded with that famous line, "God doesn't call the equipped; He equips the called". And she encouraged me that I'll have a team of women with the planning gifts that I felt were missing in my skill set. She was right, of course! The yes to her invitation felt scary, but

also, it felt right. I knew God wanted to grow me in courage and confidence in Him. And He continues to do that today after 5 years in this role as the women's ministry coordinator.

As the Coordinator, I oversee multiple ministries:

- 1. TBS (Tuesday Bible Study) has been a pillar for over 30 years. We host about 100 women each Tuesday.
- 2. Senior Sisters Luncheons is the fourth Thursday of the month where an average of 60 women gather to have lunch, hear a speaker, share prayers and occasionally do a craft.
- 3. Grace Moms Group has about 30 moms with kids under 5 years old and meet twice a month on Wednesdays for a devotional time, worship, parenting discussions and prayer.
- 4. Book club meets first Mondays of the month.

Plus monthly meetings with my volunteer leader team to plan:

Multiple gatherings throughout the year: Soup, Song & Story night in the Fall, Paint Parties in the Spring, Ice Cream Socials in the summer.

May the women we serve grow in the knowledge of their belovedness, their gifts, the power of the Holy Spirit, their passions and callings to the Glory of God, and our Lord, Jesus Christ. Amen.

We host a retreat every other year. 2021 Arise, Shine for the Glory of the Lord is upon you... was my first retreat.

We just returned from my second retreat: 2023 Abide in the Vine, where 200 women traveled to Maumee Bay Lodge and Conference center in Ohio for 2 nights of worship, teaching, prayer sessions, nature walks, fun and fellowship.

What are some of the joys you have experienced and challenges you have encountered in this role?

I'm riding a joy wave right now. Retreats are such hard work, yet, the stories I'm hearing of breakthroughs, and prayers answered and women experiencing the powerful presence of God in worship... give me so much JOY... is there anything better than that? Also, at the end of each ministry season, we'll have a celebration meal where women can share testimonies of God's goodness and faithfulness. Hearing stories of transformation is just the best!

Some of the struggles I've experienced in this role have been in leadership conflicts. Navigating different personalities in serving together can be a challenge. In my naivety I thought working with people in church would be easy. We all want to love and serve God plus prefer one other, right? LOL. Each ministry I oversee has 2 volunteer facilitators that I meet with to pray and plan for their gatherings. One ministry leader team in particular has had multiple differences of opinions as to how they see the group should flow. So I've had to learn a number of conflict resolution strategies in order to keep this leader team working well together. It's been hard, but good. God is teaching us all so much about confession, forgiveness, listening, understanding, empathy, on and on.

In light of the challenges and joys you are experiencing, do you have any nuggets of wisdom to offer other women in church leadership?

I have 3 nuggets that have helped me:

- 1. Take a prayer day. My boss, our lead pastor, reminds me to do this too. I have my time in the morning with the Lord, but then quickly go into task-mode. Emails, checklists, etc. There is something so sweet about carving out a whole day to commune with Jesus. To behold Him. To worship Him. To quiet my soul long enough to Listen to Him.
- 2. Have a spiritual director or mentor. There are some frustrating things that can happen in ministry and on church staff teams that I've needed to process with a safe, nonjudgmental, 3rd party. If I complain to someone I work with, that could cause division, and I certainly do not want to do that. My spiritual director has encouraged me, prayed for me, imparted wise counsel and helped me see my own blind-spots.
- 3. Meet with and learn from women that are different than you. Because our world is broken in many ways – people divided by race, economics, political affiliations, and heritage – our desire at Grace is to take these fragments of brokenness and bring them together to form a beautiful mosaic where we can find unity in Christ. I believe it is important to have diverse leader teams to reflect God's Kingdom and intentionally, creatively serve the women in your church.

Tell us a little about your family – brag a little!

Bill, my husband and best friend of 26 years loves to travel, sail, ski, and tinker with 3D printing stuff. My oldest daughter, Emma, 22 graduated from Marquette University in Milwaukee and moved to Colorado with some friends. She is a registered nurse, avid climber, hiker, skier. Audrey, 21 our second born is a student at Wayne State University in Detroit. She loves to shop, snowboard, and serve as a youth group leader at our church. Will, 18, our only son is a senior in high school. He enjoys swimming, weight lifting and is currently trying to decide where to go to college in the fall. Our baby, Kayley, 16 enjoys reading, drawing and playing the guitar.

The day was spent in open conversation about caring for one's soul as we viewed a training session videotaped by Mindy Caliguire.

With the help of Mindy, co-founder

of Soul Care, a spiritual formation ministry that exists to increase 'soul health', the women were challenged to make their relationship with God the priority that drives not only their personal life but overflows into the relationships with those met in their ministry roles. As leaders we are challenged to lead from the soul. When our souls are alive to God – profusely rooted in Him this kind of leadership emerges:

Characteristics of those who lead from the soul

- They are peace-filled in crises as well as in calm times. And during crises, they do not revert to authoritarian or avoidance behaviors.
- They know intimately what it means to be part of or create community.
- They do not depend on themselves for the vision of the organization.
- They can give power away without feeling a loss of self.
- They are connected intimately to God.
- They do not project their pain or addiction on others.
- They do not burn out or succumb to stress.
- They practice integrity, reflection, and collaboration.
- They have a strong sense of humor and creativity.
- They are courageous.
- Above all, they are life-giving.

A t the center of Christian peace is not a philosophy or a practice, it is a person – the God-man Jesus Christ: "For he himself is our peace" (Ephesians 2:14a NIV). It is this peace in which everything was created and humanity was called to live. It is this peace, grounded in the person and nature of Jesus, that Christ followers are to reflect into the chaos of the world around them as the imago Dei.

Christ's church, being the presence of God's Kingdom on earth, is charged

with making and reflecting his peace in the world. Because his Spirit inhabits his people, we as the body of Christ are to take up Christ's mission to restore peace with God, as well as with others, with ourselves, and with creation. This is reflected in the person and nature of Christ in three ways:

- Christ's power to restore peace between an individual and God.
- Christ's desire to establish peace within the community of believers.
- Christ's call for the Church to extend his peace to the world as we engage

individuals outside the family of faith and engage with creation that groans in anticipation of redemption.

Christ commissions his church to be his presence of peace in a world of discord. Triennial 2024 will be all about living into the peace we have in Christ and exploring how we represent Christ's peace.


A 31-day Bible Reading Plan and Journal
