Leadership in the Philippines

ur team continues to introduce you to women in the NAB family who are in ministry leadership positions within their churches, communities and on our mission fields. Our hope is that women who serve in leadership roles will be encouraged by their stories.

Claire Marker is from Legazpi City, Philippines. She is a 2006 graduate of Bicol Centre for Christian Leadership and a 2011 graduate of the Cebu

partners in the Baptist Conference of the Philippines. Through a providential turn of events, Claire met and has now married Timothy Marker, a member of First Baptist Church of Lodi, California, and a graduate of Western Seminary. Claire and Tim have a heart for missions, serving as mission mentors with OMF International and teaching at Bicol Center for Christian Leadership (BCCL). Claire is prepared to lead BCCL into its next era of ministry.

How did you become a part of the ministry at BCCL? What is your role at the Center?

I got involved with the BCCL ministry by simply sharing the Gospel to a co-worker at the government health insurance company I worked at in 2004. By God's grace, this coworker came to know the Lord and was looking for a Christian church when she met sis Mayette Ativo (who was still single and the director of BCCL back then). Sis Mayette got intrigued by the believer (myself) who led my coworker to Christ that she asked my coworker if she could talk to me. Sis Mayette invited me to get Biblical and ministry training at BCCL.

I had been praying to get some Biblical and ministry training at a seminary but it was so expensive, and I had to move out of my home city (I was taking care of my dad who had a stroke

> back then) to do so. BCCL offered affordable yet quality ministry training.

I was doing my thesis for the master's degree in management that I was taking at a state university at that time. The subject of my thesis was about discipleship

as the Human Resource Development program of evangelical churches. When I found out that a lot of pastors were attending at BCCL, I saw them as potential respondents for my research and immediately signed up for the classes at BCCL! A bit of a wrong motive there but wrong that went good.

By the time I graduated from its basic course, God had called me into fulltime ministry as full-time staff at BCCL. From being on the admin staff I became one of its local teachers, then assistant director and currently the director since sis Mayette, the founding director, passed away in 2020.

What excites you about the leadership opportunities you have at BCCL?

Just the opportunity to mentor our staff and students to be the servantleaders that God wants them to be excites me. Helping them find their role in ministry and missions (BCCL's emphasis these days) and grow and flourish in it brings me so much joy.

What are some particular challenges you have encountered in your role at BCCL?

One of the challenges at first was overseeing the ministry remotely. For more than two years during the pandemic, I was living in California with my husband and we couldn't travel back to the Philippines. I had to lead the ministry remotely, so I had a reverse schedule of being awake all night and asleep during the day. It was a weird time but the sacrifice was all worth it.

Another challenge at first was the inadequacies that the current staff including myself had on technological (online classes, etc.) and numbers (financial management) matters. But God has amazingly brought the right people at the right time. I am so blessed with a team of staff that is very efficient in what they do. Even if I was leading them remotely, the ministry was running like a well-oiled machine. Thanks be to God!

How has your role at BCCL helped you grow or brought you joy?

My husband and I have explored the possibility of us becoming long-term missionaries somewhere in East Asia. But we found out soon enough that we weren't church planters. We are equippers, teachers, and we love to mentor people. This is how my role in BCCL has helped me grow. I am flowing in the giftings that God has given me.

We have just started the Intercultural Ministries (ICM) curriculum this year and it has been bringing us so much joy that we able to channel our passion for missions by being able to mobilize our students and their churches to get involved in missions. God has done so many amazing things over the last few months in our ICM program that it is making me grow all the more as a mission's mobilizer and as a servantleader as well, as I lead by doing, by God's wonderful grace.

Are there any books offering leadership suggestions that you would recommend?

I would recommend *The Jesus Creed: Loving God, Loving Others* by Scot McKnight. It's a good reminder that to be good at serving and leading others, we should lead, by example, first and foremost in loving God with all of our

heart, soul, mind, and strength. Serving and leading and influencing others should emanate from a passionate love relationship with God. As I love Him more and more, I develop His love for the people around me, thus, I am able to minister and lead them as God wants me to do so.

How can the women in our North American Baptist churches support you?

Through prayers first of all. We need to be surrounded with serious intercession as the BCCL team and I are at a new season.

We are leading our ICM students to interact and engage cross-culturally with people from other religions. A simple interview with Hindu medical students has given birth to a regular (monthly) cultural exchange ministry. We experience the spiritual battle each time we interact with them with the love of Christ. So please be interceding for us.

A prayer concern would also be for God's provision for the regular support of the BCCL ministry; it has been on deficit for a few years now. Pray for generous hearts that would help with BCCL's monthly support. Pray also for provision as we take our ICM students on much-needed short-term mission exposure trips in-country and maybe in East Asia as well (where there are a lot of unreached people groups at 3.2 billion people!).


Please also pray for Tim and I; we decided to move to the Philippines early this year due to the ministry's great need that I lead it in person. We are currently not official missionaries of any organization, so raising funds

for our living expenses is not easy. We continue to trust that where God leads, He will provide.

Also, please pray for strength and less stress for us each day. Until now we are not yet quite settled in our place—our kitchen is still gutted, although it is now slowly being built but it's been difficult cooking outside and washing dishes

in our bathroom sink, etc., but we know that's part of the adventures of missionary life. Little things like the constant brownouts, broken pipes, devices not working as they should can sometimes get to us and can be distracting, so we would appreciate your prayers a lot!

Thank you so much for this opportunity of sharing God's work in my life and ministry!



They participated in volunteer services that are close to Wilma's heart. The women visited the White Cross facility (Century Baptist's For the City) to see supplies heading to Cameroon and Mbingo Baptist Hospital and to make layettes to include in the shipment. They spent time at Century Baptist rolling bandages and cutting much-needed squares, singing joyfully as they worked. The Sakerettes came from all over the US and celebrated the life and ministry of a very special lady in their lives—Wilma Binder.

- Christ's call for the Church to extend his peace to the world as we engage


individuals outside the family of faith and engage with creation that groans in anticipation of redemption.

Women's Connection will have a luncheon on Friday, July 12, 2024. Watch for more information.






