NAB Expectations

The following are the expectations of participants of either the Year of Equipping or Internship Residency:

- Is in agreement with Statement of Faith, Statement on Marriage, and Ethical Statement.
- Has a connection to a region/cluster/church. This is a ministry that flows from, by, to, or with an NAB ministry connection.
- Is supportive of the Four Ends and is connected to NAB ministry initiatives.
- Will meet on an annual basis with the Executive Team representative to ensure compliance still in effect.
- Is open to NAB-Connect, the NAB orientation webinar.

Year of Equipping

Cost Associated: \$2,500 USD

Timeframe: 9 months

Year of Equipping is an emerging leader cohort composed of three modules, each three months long and each reflecting the three teaching sessions in Blue Ocean. The first module addresses questions of who God is and what he is up to. The second module takes on the topic of spiritual formation, as we discuss how we are being re-formed in God's image as we join him on his mission. Module three addresses how Christian community flows from the first two, and we discuss what we are to do in light of who God is and how he is forming us. In each module, we read a book pertaining to the subject matter; expect a commitment to two two-hour video discussions and an in-person meeting for each module.

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Great Lakes Association Ohio Cluster Internship Residency

Cost Associated: Paid Position

Timeframe: 9 months / 2 years

Location: Great Lakes Association

This program develops spiritually formed ministry leaders through hands-on ministry, academic partnership with Kairos University, and one-on-one mentoring with seasoned pastoral staff. Interns (9months) and Residents (2 years) receive compensation, spiritual formation time, and educational support aimed at producing ministry-ready leaders who can serve across the GLA Cluster and beyond to lead the church into the next generation. Your experience in the program will count as progress toward earning a bachelor's or master's degree, depending on your education background and goals. There are various pathways available for emerging leaders exploring or actively pursuing vocational ministry.

Disciples Seminary

Cost Associated: \$300 USD per month

Timeframe: dependent upon degree program (BA/MA, MA, BA/MDiv, MDiv, DMin)

Location: NAB Northwest

Disciples Seminary was created to provide competency-based theological education for the purpose of training NABNW pastors, missionaries, and church leaders to be sent out from NABNW churches. With the ever-increasing costs of traditional theological education, Disciples Seminary significantly lowers that cost for an accredited degree that brings a theological education under the NABNW local church. Students work with their local NABNW church and a mentor/discipleship team of three people who help shape the student's outcomes. Every class, project, and assignment works toward the student's chosen degree outcomes. We have an array of learning experiences we continually add to. We use learning cohorts (online), self-paced courses (online), and church-based classes (in person), as well as customized learning paths tailored to the student and the church context. The learning journey is shaped by the student's mentor team.

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One-Eighty Residency

Cost Associated: \$9,600–15,000 USD (Scholarships available)

Timeframe: 12 months

Location: Lodi, California

The One-Eighty Residency Program is a one-year residential internship for young adults (18–25) designed to give a comprehensive introduction to mission, theology, and practical life. Through formal and informal gatherings and practices, our residents will learn how to live life with others in a dorm setting, see the beauty in cross-cultural ministry, learn how God is already working in and through them, and practice rhythms that will keep them grounded throughout their year together. Through this program, residents will receive: a full year of deep spiritual formation in close community; a broad understanding of contextual theology and missiology; experience in youth ministry, outdoor education, and adventure programming; and experience in adolescent mental health and community development. Through our partnership with Kairos University, our residents can receive 54 credits toward their bachelor of arts degree or a Certificate in Contextual Mission and Praxis. New cohorts start every year at the end of July.

The New Pastor's Cohort program is designed to equip and encourage current and aspiring ministry leaders through intentional learning and mentorship. Participants will engage in a monthly Zoom call featuring two different presenters who bring practical experience and insight into key areas of ministry leadership. The program also includes a two-day retreat focused on personal growth, networking, and spiritual renewal. Topics covered throughout the year include preaching, pastoral care, discipleship pathways, ministry philosophy development, family relationships, CliftonStrengths, and building resiliency for long-term ministry effectiveness.

Location: Alberta

With a planned start date of the fall of 2027, Word and Table will be an immersive Christian training experience designed to help young adults discern God's direction for their lives and explore deeper questions about faith, purpose, and calling. The name reflects two essential streams of Christian formation: Word, which emphasizes a deep foundation in Scripture and historic Christian faith, and Table, which focuses on practical ministry, hospitality, compassion, and serving others. Built around the rhythms of worship, community, and mission, the program seeks to shape participants both spiritually and practically. Through intentional discipleship and hands-on experience, young adults are equipped to live out their faith with conviction, character, and purpose.

As they serve alongside an experienced ministry team, interns gain practical ministry experience while gradually assuming greater responsibility in a variety of ministry settings. Throughout the year, interns receive intentional coaching and mentoring while participating in leadership development and spiritual formation that support both their personal and ministry growth. The internship is designed to cultivate Christ-like character, ministry competence, and a deeper understanding of vocational Christian ministry.
